The Village of Nashville is requesting Bids for the construction of Putnam Park Improvements. Bids for the construction of the project will be received at the Village Office located at 203 N. Main Street, P.O. Box 587, Nashville, MI 49073 until **2:00 p.m. local time, Wednesday, February 26, 2025**. At that time the Bids received will be publicly opened and read.

The project includes HMA paving, concrete sidewalk, concrete ramps with railings, concrete stairs with railings, pickleball courts, basketball court, fence installation, permanent soil erosion, playground main structure, swing set, merry-go-round, playground area engineered wood fiber surfacing, playground area concrete edging, aggregate trail, learning displays, catch basins, storm sewer, water, underground electrical, and site lighting.

The Michigan Department of Natural Resources Spark Grant is being used for this project; all relevant state or federal requirements apply.

The Contractor and all subcontractors must comply with all requirements of 1976 PA 453 (Elliott-Larsen Civil Rights Act), the 1976 PA 220 (Persons with Disabilities Civil Rights Act) and Executive Directive 2019-09, as amended. In accordance with these laws, all contracts the grantee enters into must contain a covenant by the contractor and any subcontractors not to discriminate against an employee or applicant for employment with respect to hire, tenure, terms, conditions or privileges of employment, or a matter directly or indirectly related to employment, because of race, color, religion, national origin, age, sex, height, weight, marital status, partisan considerations, or a disability or genetic information that is unrelated to the individual's ability to perform the duties of a particular job or position.

The Davis-Bacon Act, as amended (40 U.S.C. 3141-3148) and Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (40 U.S.C. 3701-3708) will be required. In accordance with the statute, contractors must be required to pay wages to laborers and mechanics at a rate not less than the prevailing wages specified in a wage determination made by the U.S. Secretary of Labor.

The date the Bidding Documents are transmitted by the Issuing Office will be considered the Bidder's date of receipt of the Bidding Documents.

For all further requirements regarding bid submittal, qualifications, procedures, and contract award, refer to the Instructions to Bidders that are included in the Bidding Documents.

The Village of Nashville reserves the right to accept any bid, reject any or all bids, to waive informalities and make the award in any manner deemed in the best interest of the Village of Nashville.
