**Insurance Renewal 2025-26 – David Chapman**

**HydroCorp contract**

Pierce explained the reasoning to contract with HydroCorp to stay in compliance with Egle for Cross Connection inspections. **Police Department Renovation**

Pierce provided a breakdown of the funds needed to complete the renovation for the police department. A motion was made by White and supported by Courtney to approve an additional \$38,600.00 in funding to complete the renovation of the police department upstairs. **Appoint Council Trustee – 1 open seat.**

There were four applicants for the open seat: Rick Argo, Terra Nassif, Scott Fouse and Jenna Weiler. A Meet and Greet / Q&A was held during a work session prior to meeting. Council Voted; Rick Argo – 3, Terra Nassif – 1, Scott Fouse – 1, Jenna Weiler – 0.

**Trick or Treating**
