ORDINANCE #02-12-2026

Council Member Argo, supported by Council Member Courtney, moved the adoption of the following ordinance:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO 1-11-1979-B. ENTITLED “AN ORDINANCE REGULATING CROSS CONNECTIONS WITH THE PUBLIC WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM, A CONNECTION OR ARRANGEMENT OF PIPING OR APPURTENANCES THROUGH WHICH WATER OF QUESTIONABLE QUALITY, WASTES OR OTHER CONTAMINANTS CAN ENTER THE PUBLIC SUPPLY SYSTEM”

THE VILLAGE OF NASHVILLE ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. Amendment of Section 1, Ordinance No. 1-11-1979-B. That Section 1, Ordinance No. 1-11-1979-B is amended to read in its entirety as follows:

SECTION 1. That the Village of Nashville adopts by reference the water supply cross connection rules of the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy being R 325.11401 to R 325.11407 of the Michigan Administrative Code.

SECTION 2. Amendment of Section 2, Ordinance No. 1-11-1979-B. That Section 2, Ordinance No. 1-11-1979-B is amended to read in its entirety as follows:

SECTION 2. That it shall be the duty of the Nashville water department to cause inspection to be made of all properties served by the public water supply where cross connections with the public water supply is deemed possible. The frequency of inspections and reinspection's based on potential health hazards involved shall be as established by the Nashville water department and as approved by the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy

SECTION 3. Amendment of Section 5, Ordinance No. 1-11-1979-B. That Section 5, Ordinance No. 1-11-1979-B is amended to read in its entirety as follows:

SECTION 5. That all testable back flow prevention devices shall be tested initially upon installation, relocation and/or repair to be sure that the device is working properly. Subsequent testing of assemblies shall be conducted on a annual basis or at a time interval specified by the Nashville Water Department and in accordance with Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy requirements. Only licensed plumbers that hold an active ASSE 5110 tester's certification shall be qualified to perform such testing. That individual (s) shall certify the results of his/her testing.

SECTION 4. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall be published in accordance with state law and shall become effective twenty (20) days after its adoption or upon its publication, whichever occurs later.
